COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This year’s lecture presentation can stand alone as an emergency review course, but is also an all-day didactic preparation for the SimMan hands-on simulation training on Saturday.

This all day seminar presented by two outstanding dental anesthesia educators and clinicians, will focus on a topic of increasing concern in dental anesthesia: the safe practice of sedation and anesthesia in the dental office setting. In a time when we are unfortunately witnessing an increase in morbidity and mortality from dental office anesthesia and we are under increasing scrutiny from regulators, insurers, and media, it is all the more important that we focus on the safe administration of sedation and anesthesia in dental offices. Dentistry has a long history of providing safe anesthesia, and the best way to protect that legacy and privilege is to continue to advance the standard of care in the anesthesia services we provide. This seminar will focus on advances in outpatient sedation and general anesthesia, current standards of care in safe anesthesia practice, and how we

can incorporate safety “best practices” into our administration of office anesthesia.

Additionally, Dr. Clive Rayner, FDSA Director, will present an overview of current and pending sedation regulations in Florida.

Drs. Fonner and Okundaye will present a full day series of presentations on:

- New ways to help prepare your office to handle any medical emergency
- The use of cognitive aids (i.e. emergency algorithms) with the dental anesthesia team model
- Understand the prevention, recognition, and management of airway complications
- Learn to use the new ADSA “Ten Minutes Saves a Life!” Emergency Manual and the new Mobile Office Emergency App
- In-depth review of the management of common sedation emergencies in the dental office

- Understand the pathophysiology of various airway emergencies, and how to recognize and treat them: over-sedation, obstruction, foreign body, laryngospasm, bronchospasm, aspiration, anaphylaxis, etc.
- Understand why the entire dental team must be prepared and trained for anesthesia emergencies in the office even when an anesthesiologist is utilized
- The importance of regular hands-on emergency simulation training for the entire office team, and how to effectively involve your dental team in emergency management
- The use of “high-fidelity” emergency simulation training and “crisis resource management “ in office team training
- Failed sedation and when to say “no”

This course is an excellent preparation for the doctor and team for the high-fidelity emergency simulation training to follow on Saturday!



MEET THE PRESENTERS



Dr. Amanda Okundaye, a graduate of the UCLA dental anesthesiology residency, has a full time private practice providing outpatient general anesthesia for dentistry in Las Vegas. Additionally, she has faculty appointments at the UCLA Department of Hospital Dentistry and the USC Ostrow School of Dentistry. She teaches IV sedation courses at the University of Nevada Las Vegas and Oregon Health Science University, and is a frequent lecturer / instructor at ADSA seminars and SimMan courses. She is a diplomate of both the American Dental Board of Anesthesiology and the National Dental Board of Anesthesiology.



Dr. Andrea Fonner is a full time practicing dentist anesthesiologist in Seattle, Washington, providing outpatient general anesthesia for dentistry. She is a graduate of the dental anesthesiology residency at UCLA. She has faculty appointments at Swedish Medical Center in Seattle, and at USC Ostrow School of Dentistry. She also teaches IV sedation at Oregon Health Sciences University, and is the co-director of the ADSA SimMan simulation training, and is a frequent lecturer for ADSA. She is a diplomate of both the American Dental Board of Anesthesiology and the National Dental Board of Anesthesiology.

FDSA's unique, fast-paced, emergency simulation training is still the only course of its kind in Florida! This intensive 5 hour, hands-on, “hi-fidelity” simulation training uses the Laerdal Sim-Man, a concentrated 4:1 student-faculty ratio, and a group of highly experienced anesthesia faculty. Emergency scenarios will be customized to the type and depth of sedation you provide and the emergencies you are likely to encounter in real dental practice. Each participant will first rotate through four

emergency “task training” stations to learn and practice emergency skills. The student then typically participates in 10–12 different emergency scenarios, and “leads” the management of several “emergencies.” Following each scenario, a debriefing by faculty then reviews the efficacy of the intervention. Unlike the intimidating, feared ACLS courses of the past, the emphasis in this course is on learning and practicing in a respectful, non-threatening, confidential, interactive, immersive, educational

experience. This is a great way to expand your knowledge and build team confidence through hands-on training, observation, and review.



THE COURSE WILL REVIEW:

- The recognition and assessment of the emergency
- The management of sedation emergencies in the office based environment
- Basic and advanced airway management
- The use of simple and advanced airway adjuncts, including the role of LMAs and video laryngoscopy
- Dosing and administration of the most common emergency management medications
- Effective BLS and ACLS performance
- Effective ventilatory, respiratory, and cardiovascular monitoring
- Effective, high performance emergency team dynamics
- The importance of “cognitive aids” (emergency algorithms) in an emergency
- Understand when and how to call for help in the office and what to expect from EMS
- Understand why the entire dental team must be prepared and trained for anesthesia emergencies in the office even when an anesthesiologist is utilized

Course space is limited to 18 participants per AM and PM session to create a high faculty-student ratio, and give each participant extensive hands-on experience. Auxiliary staff are encouraged to attend with their doctor, but are limited to two staff per doctor, and should be fully prepared by their doctor before attending.
